



Grad 2018 Boat Cruise Thursday, Sept 27th, 2018

The first H.J. Cambie Grad Event is the Boat Cruise on Thursday, Sept. 27th, 2018. This event is always a highlight of the year for our grads!

Tickets: Purchase from Ms. Yip for \$60.00. Deadline to purchase: Tuesday, Sept. 18th. Must sell 100 tickets to make this event happen!

Guests: This is the only grad event where outside guests may attend. Guest application forms are available in the office and must be returned to Mr. Jaswal by Monday, Sept. 17th, 12:00pm.

Time:

Boarding begins at **5:30pm**. The boat will leave at 6:00pm (no later) and return at 9:00pm. **The boat will not wait for students who are late.** Upon return students are dismissed downtown at the dock.

Drop off/Pick Up:

Students are expected to arrange their own transportation to and from this event. No bus service will be provided by the school for transportation to or from downtown. Students and parents are encouraged to arrange carpools to and from downtown. Plan ahead and ensure it is a fun, safe evening! Give yourself lots of time to get downtown as traffic is often busy at this time in the evening. If you are driving, pay parking is available in a parking lot at the base of Denman. There is no parking lot attendant, so please bring coins or a credit card to purchase your parking ticket from the machine. **THEY WILL TOW YOUR VEHICLE IF YOU DO NOT PURCHASE A TICKET!!**

Travel Home from Cruise:

Following the boat cruise, students and their parents are expected to arrange a safe ride home from downtown.

Supervision:

School staff will be present onboard the boat to supervise students from 6:00-9:00pm only. **Once the boat returns to the dock at 9:00pm, staff chaperones will no longer be responsible for student supervision.** It is the responsibility of the students and their parents/guardians to arrange for safe transportation back to Richmond.

Security:

To ensure this is a safe and dry event, all students will be thoroughly checked by security personnel from the charter company prior to loading the boat. Security will also be on the boat.

Dress:

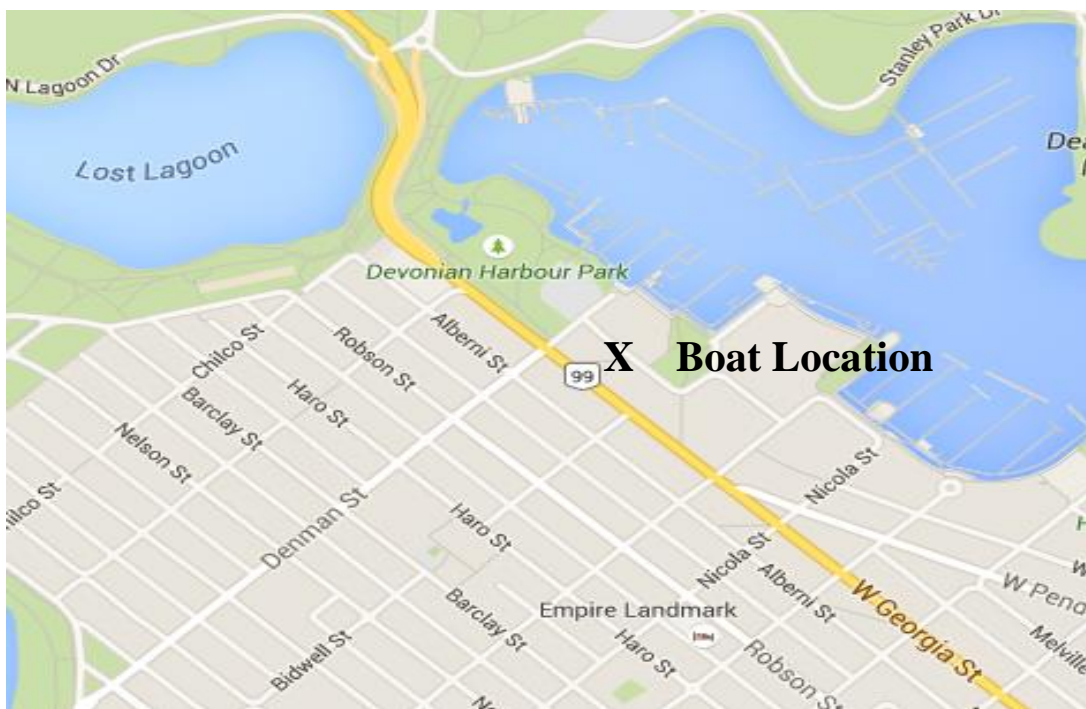
Dress is semi-formal. Students are encouraged to wear layers or bring a sweater/jacket as it will be warm inside but cool outside on the deck.

School is in session on Thursday 27th and all grads are expected to be at school in all classes. Students not in full attendance may NOT be allowed on the cruise. Students that are attending the boat cruise must adhere to the District's Code of Conduct . Please read it before you attend the cruise.

District Code of Conduct

- comply with the purpose and spirit of the BC Human Rights Code, including not engaging in discriminatory conduct on the basis of gender, race, colour, ancestry, place of origin, religion, marital status, family status, physical or mental disability, or sexual orientation;
- not threaten, harass, intimidate, bully or assault, in any way, any person within the school community directly or indirectly, through print or electronic media; and
- not be in possession of weapons, dangerous articles, alcohol, or illegal drugs while in school or at school functions.
