Some key dates to note:

- Valedictory \$55 Valedictory fee AND write-up (brief personal message to be read as students cross the stage) are both <u>due March 14th</u>. Also, the fee must be paid in full, by the deadline, in order for the school to place a customized grad gown order for each student planning to participate.
