Student Learning Survey (Gr 10-12)

Students' voices are a big component of the Cambie community, and on Feb 26, 28, and March 1, our Grade 10-12 students will take some time from their class to participate in a student survey. These surveys are anonymous, and the information gathered will be used to help support all of our learners.

What to expect:

Grade 10 & 12: These students will take the Student Learning Survey, which takes approximately 20 minutes. It aims to gather valuable feedback on their experiences at school, including academics, extracurriculars, and overall well-being.

Grade 11: These students will complete the Youth Development Instrument (YDI) survey. This takes roughly 45 minutes and focuses on various aspects of student development, such as social-emotional learning, civic engagement, and future aspirations.

Parent surveys are also available to be completed by parents with children in Grades 4, 7, 10, and 12 at www.bced.gov.bc.ca/sat_survey/access.htm until May 3rd. It is available in 18 different languages and the survey will take approximately 30 minutes to complete. Your responses are voluntary and anonymous, and your child will not be identified as a result of your participation in the survey. Any personal or identifying information will be deleted before results are stored. Data will be stored and accessible only within Canada. **Parents may access the survey through the Parent 'Direct Access' section from the website listed above by selecting their child's district, school's name, and language of preference.**
