# **URGENT – DAG Communication**

#### To All Cambie Parents, Guardians, Families and Grade 12 Students:

First, thank you to all those parent and student volunteers on Saturday at the Bottle Drive and to those families who generously dropped off their recyclables. Thank you for your support. Despite collecting over 1900 containers, we only managed to yield a profit of \$215. Unfortunately, it highlights that we are NOT on target to meet the minimum amount to cover base costs within the next 5 months. Our goal is \$4000 in fundraising and donation/sponsorship (this is on top of meeting the minimum ticket sales of 80 tix). While this is not an unreasonable goal, we are furthered impacted by lack of engagement and participation. The first DAG Planning Meeting earlier this month had no attendees (except Nicole & Ilianna). We cannot put this large-scale event on without support from the parents and at this point, we are considering <u>CANCELLLING</u> the Dry-After Grad in order to mitigate further losses (we would lose all our deposits).

The reality is even with multiple fundraisers yielding only few hundred dollars each, we cannot achieve our financial goals. We need to switch our focus to local company donations and corporate sponsorship. We are asking at least one or two parents to please set forward and take on this dedicated role. It is now going to be vital to achieve donation/sponsorship goals in order for the event to proceed.

In addition, we are asking all parents and families help with the following:

- Please continue to save your recycling we will host another Bottle Drive in the Spring (April).
- Please support our other upcoming DAG fundraisers (50/50 Raffle & Columbia Meat sales)
- Check with your employers and other contacts to see if they would be willing to donate (either cash or towards door prizes). Donation letter and tax receipt form re-attached
- Consider volunteering (regardless of grade) to support the DAG event. We need:
  - 8-12 parent volunteers with vehicles to shuttle students from Mayfair Lakes (dinner/dance) to Cambie (DAG) on June 24 11pm-12 and willing to sign District Parent Driver's Form in the office. Due to changes to District's busing policy, we were unable to afford the drastic increases in busing costs (\$2400-3000). Parent driver/vehicle shuttles is our only option to ensure the budget goes towards students' fun.
  - 1-2 Shoppers to buys supplies/pick-up pre-ordered food couple of days before and day of (June 24).
  - 8-10 volunteers for the actual event (June 24 10:30pm-June 25 5am) for various positions (check-in, bag check, security/supervision, food prep/service). It is not only that we need the people to run the event, BUT due to District and Insurance requirements, it is mandatory, we have enough parent supervision for certain activities.
  - Buy your DAG tickets early! We still need to meet the minimum sale of 80-90 tickets. Ticket sales are still a significant part of our budget.
  - Please attend the next DAG Planning Meeting on <u>Thursday</u>. <u>April 10 at</u> <u>7pm</u> at Tim Horton's (across from the school).

The Class of 2025 felt the impacted by COVID lock-down (they missed Grade 7 Farewells during 2020 lockdowns, entry into High School was under full COVID restrictions, & missed a lot of normal High School experiences). This is one of their last chances of a High School celebration; especially after Winter Formal, and no boat cruise, DAG will be their last opportunity to celebrate. In addition, Dry-After Grads play an important role in keeping our students, roads and greater community safe.

Planning for 2025 DAG event has already begun and both bookings & deposits have been made. Despite recent changes to SD38 & insurance requirements and higher incurred costs, Cambie DAG was in the works to have some changes from previous years: including arcade & interactive games, premium digital/paper Photo Booth, Laser Tag in the gym, DJ, Professional Caricaturist, games throughout the night with chances to win gift cards, door prizes, expanded food menu with more variety (including Sundae Bar & surprise food delivery at 3am) – all CONFIRMED. In addition, we were working on (depending on expanding our budget), adding a Magician & Glitter Tattoo Artist as vendors. The focus this year was going to be on providing all-night entertainment for the students.
