Provincial Literacy Graduation Assessments for Grades 10 and 12
Grade 10 and 12 students at Cambie will be writing their Provincial Literacy Assessments on November 5th. These assessments are graduation requirements that must be completed in order to graduate. The Grade 10 (GLA 10) and Grade 12 (GLA 12) Literacy Assessments evaluate students' ability to think critically and reflectively, analyze and make meaning from a variety of texts, and communicate their own ideas or those presented in the readings.

The Grade 12 Literacy Assessment is not tied to any specific subject or course; instead, it draws on learning and skills developed across multiple subjects from Kindergarten through Grade 10/12.If you have not already done so, you are encouraged to visit the Provincial Literacy Assessment website for more information, including the assessment format and sample questions:

Request for the Administration of Medication at the School
The School District #38 (Richmond), in collaboration with Vancouver Coastal Health – Richmond, has guidelines in place regarding the administration of prescribed medications.

In accordance with these guidelines, non-prescription medications such as Tylenol, Advil, Benadryl, etc. will not be administered by Richmond School District staff and will not be kept at school.

For students who require prescribed medications to be administered by school staff, a Request for Administration of Medication at School (RAMS) form is necessary to be completed. This form is available at the school office, or on request, can be emailed to you at home. This RAMS form should be taken to your pharmacy so that the prescription label can be attached and then brought to your child's school along with the prescribed medication.

Each summer, all medications will be sent home. This will give you the opportunity to use the medication over the summer. At the start of each
