
Cambie Theatre Presents... "Twelfth Night"

Please follow the instructions below to submit a CRC request. The results of your CRC will be sent directly to the school district.

There is no cost for volunteers to obtain a CRC, and the process is online efficient. Please visit <https://justice.gov.bc.ca/screening/crrpa/org-access> or use the QR code to visit the website shown below.



Criminal Record Check Application

Criminal Record Check

In British Columbia, if you work or volunteer with, or have the potential for unsupervised access to children and/or vulnerable adults, you are required to complete a criminal record check.

How do I submit a CRC request online?

To submit an online request for a criminal record check, you must:

- Be at least 12 years of age as of today's date.
- Have an access code provided by your organization.
- Have your identity verified by using the BC Services Card Login. If you choose not to use the BC Services Card Login, your organization will verify your ID after you submit your criminal record check.

The Volunteer Driver Authorization Form has been revised and is now being used. This updated version reflects current district requirements, including the completion of a criminal record check for all volunteer drivers prior to participating in any school-related driving activities.

Going forward for all new field trips, volunteer driving may only occur once both the Driver Authorization Form and the required criminal record check have been completed.

Criminal Record Checks (CRC's) for school volunteers can now be completed by the volunteers through online submission and at no cost to the individual. The process is reported to take less than 5 minutes. If you become aware that you will be volunteering for a field trip or other activity transportation, you may save yourself time if you completed the Criminal Records check submission in advance of needing to fill out the Volunteer Driver Form at the school office. If you do complete this in advance, please forward a copy of the confirmation to the office at the time of filling out the Volunteer Driver form with school office staff.
