The Numeracy 10 assessment will take place on **Wednesday, April 22** for all grade 10 students. Look for your name and note the date, time, and location of your assessment. ALL students MUST write during the date/session assigned. **The assessment will run from 8:40am - 11:40am.**

- Bring pencil and eraser (calculator is optional – assessment has a built-in calculator feature to use)
- Arrive at least 15 minutes early for sign-in
