### BOOKING INSTRUCTIONS:

1. **Enter your one-time-use access code in the Promotional Code box below the booking instructions.** Your one-time-use access code is CSS26, followed by your student number (e.g. CSS2612345). Click Go. A blue bar should appear on top of the screen saying that the code has been accepted, and your ceremony booking link will appear.
2. **Click BUY beside your Ceremony.** Select up to 2 Complimentary tickets and the number of paid tickets you are purchasing for your guests and click Continue. Check that the tickets in your Shopping Cart are correct, then click Next. *Note: Grads attending Valedictory do not need to book a complimentary or paid ticket for themselves.*
3. **Create or login to your account.** If you haven't purchased tickets with UBC Tickets previously, you will need to create an account.
4. **Complete the order!** The order is completed once you receive a six-digit confirmation number from our system.
5. **Check your email.** A confirmation email will be sent shortly after your order is completed. Be sure to check your junk or spam folder if you don't see it.

### Know what you're riding: E-Bike's & E- Scooter's

#### Richmond RCMP urges parents to check before kids hit the road on e-bikes

#### IS IT REALLY AN E-BIKE?

- Ask these 4 questions before your child rides
- Do the pedals actually work to propel the bike?
  - Does the motor stop assisting at 32 km/h or less?
  - Is the motor 500W or less in power?
  - Is your child 16+ (standard) or 14+ (light only)?

#### ANSWERED NO TO ANY? IT'S NOT A LEGAL E-BIKE.

It's a motor vehicle — and it's not legal on Richmond roads, sidewalks, bike lanes, or paths.

#### WHEN IT'S NOT AN E-BIKE, IT COSTS.

- Potential fines under the BC Motor Vehicle Act for riding an unregistered, uninsured motor vehicle:
- \$598 — No insurance
  - \$276 — No driver's licence
  - \$144 — Failing to stop for police
  - \$138 — No helmet

THAT'S \$1,156 FROM ONE TRAFFIC STOP.

PARENTS, IT'S YOUR EXPOSURE TOO.

Parents or guardians who knowingly allow an underage child to ride can face fines up to \$2,000 under provincial regulations — plus personal financial liability for damages in a collision.

With more electric two-wheelers showing up on Richmond roads, dykes, and multi-use paths, Richmond RCMP is asking parents and riders to take a closer look at their e-bikes to ensure compliance with the law.

#### KNOW BEFORE YOU RIDE

If it doesn't match the rules in the first column, it's not a legal e-bike.

has seen a steady increase in calls involving young riders on high-powered electric devices operating at unsafe speeds, on sidewalks, without helmets, and in some cases carrying passengers the device was never designed to hold. Many reports involving e-bikes have involved riders under 16 on machines that are not legally e-bikes at all...

### Please may we take your Refundable?


